



FACTS ABOUT GRAFFITI

Graffiti, also known as "tagging", is vandalism. It is not only illegal but it's costly. Graffiti is the single most destructive property crime in southern Nevada and across the nation. It costs millions of dollars annually to repair damage caused by graffiti.

Stores selling spray paint or broad-tipped markers within North Las Vegas must store/display the items in an area that requires employee assistance to access. Restricted access to spray paint or broad-tipped markers keeps minors from stealing these items or purchasing them without parental supervision.

It is unlawful to give or sell spray paint or broad-tipped

It is unlawful to give or sell spray paint or broad-tipped markers to a minor, except from a parent to child, guardian to ward, employer to employee, teacher to student, or other similar relationship.

A person convicted of graffiti may be fined \$1,000, imprisoned in the city jail for a term of six months, or both. In addition, the court will order the tagger to restore the damaged property to its original condition, and pay restitution for damage or loss caused indirectly or directly by the graffiti.

Parents will be held responsible for the civil liability as a result of the illegal actions of their minor children, including civil damages and attorneys' fees.

REPORTING GRAFFITI

The North Las Vegas ordinance regarding graffiti provides a \$250 reward for information leading to the arrest of a perpetrator.

To report graffiti in action, contact the Police. Do not approach the suspect. Give the Police the location of the tagging and a description of the individuals. Also provide the license plate of the vehicle the suspects are driving, if available.
